Moya Dodd AO is a former Matildas vicecaptain and a partner at law firm Gilbert +

Tobin. She has extensive experience on sports governing bodies, including Football Australia, the Asian Football Confederation, the International Council of Arbitration for Sport, and the FIFA Council, where she led the gender equality reform movement following the FIFAGate crisis of 2015-16. Moya was a member of Australia's successful Bid Committee for the 2023 Women's World Cup.

She has also served on the board of the Centre for Sport and Human Rights, and is currently Co-Chair of Common Goal, the world's largest football-for-good network. She is Secretary to the Board of the Women's Leagues Forum (a body of professional women's football leagues around the world). She is a Minerva mentor.

Moya regularly speaks and writes about women's football, equality, inclusion and reform issues in sport, and has been published in the New York Times, the Guardian, and the Sydney Morning Herald. She has contributed to books including Radical Football (Pitch Publishing, 2022) and The 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup: Politics, Representation, and Management (Routledge, 2023).
