All cancellations will be subject to a 50% deduction and will have to be sent in writing, to be received by the Union Internationale des Avocats **no later than August 5, 2025.**

No refund will be made for cancellations received after this date.

VISAS

Anyone who requires a visa invitation letter in order to attend the Forum should register and pay their registration fees **no later than August 5, 2025** to ensure there is enough time to obtain a visa.
